#### **Math Lab Activites**


Adding and subtracting fractions can often seem daunting, but using fraction strips can transform this complex task into a straightforward and visual experience. Fraction strips are simple tools that allow learners to see the relationships between different fractions clearly. To add fractions, start by aligning the strips according to their denominators. This visual representation helps in understanding how many parts each fraction represents. For instance, if you're adding 1/4 and 1/2, place the 1/4 strip next to the 1/2 strip. You'll quickly notice that you need another 1/4 strip to make a whole—demonstrating that 1/4 + 1/2 equals 3/4. Similarly, when subtracting fractions, fraction strips help illustrate how much of one fraction is left after taking away another. If you have a whole strip and want to subtract 1/3 from it, placing the 1/3 strip on top allows you to easily see what remains: two-thirds of the original whole. Incorporating fraction strips into your math toolkit not only enhances understanding but also builds confidence in handling fractions. This hands-on approach makes learning engaging and effective for students.


# Club Activities - House Model Activity Class 5
